

Dog Gear Guide

Harness







A well-fitted harness can keep your dog secure on leash and protect their trachea from leash-tugging injuries. Paws4ever recommends top or front clip harnesses such as the Easy Walk Harness or the Freedom Harness.

Leash



A fixed-length leash creates a clear and consistent boundary, which helps your dog learn what to expect from walks. Fixed-length leashes allow you to keep your dog and others safe.



Flexi-leads prevent dogs from understanding their boundaries, and they give you less control of your dog when you approach people, pets, and cars on your walk.

Collar



Paws4ever recommends flat collars or martingale collars. Martingale collars have an extra loop which allows a safe, limited range of tightening to discourage dogs from pulling on their leash.
