RECIPES FOR DOGS



SUMMER FROZEN PARFAIT





INGREDIENTS

Plain Greek Yogurt Frozen Blueberries Frozen Strawberries Hard plastic popsicle mold, tall enough for layering

DIRECTIONS

- 1. Add a dollop of yogurt to the bottom of mold sections
- 2. Next, add a couple of frozen berries
- 3. Keep layering with yogurt and berries until you reach the top
- 4. Freeze until ready to eat

SUBSTITUTIONS

You can use any combination of dog-safe ingredients. See page 9 for details.

TIPS

Make several at one time so you have them on hand.

OTHER COMBOS TO TRY

- Cottage cheese, frozen melon, diced cucumber
- Chicken broth with cut broccoli, and your dog's favorite treats
- Peanut butter mixed with applesauce and add diced mozzarella cheese

PUMPKIN SPICE NYLABONE

Makes more than one depending on Nylabone size

INGREDIENTS

1 cup canned pumpkin puree
½ cup soft cream cheese
½ teaspoon pure honey
¼ teaspoon cinnamon
Plain cheerios
Nylabones suited to your dog's size

DIRECTIONS

- 1. Mix all of the ingredients together in a bowl
- 2. Spread onto Nylabone in an even layer
- 3. Stick on a few Cheerios for added texture
- 4. Freeze for longer lasting enjoyment

TIPS

- You can also spread on Licki Mats, inside dog-safe bowls, or plastic containers (anything that is dog safe and accessible for your dog)
- Try spreadable mixtures between dog biscuits for a fun cookie sandwich



OTHER COMBOS


- Peanut butter
 Applesauce
 Bacon-flavored dog treats
- Rolled Oats
 Mashed bananas (add a little peanut butter to thicken if needed)
 Diced apples



PEANUT BUTTER & MOZZARELLA CHEESE BAKED TREATS







INGREDIENTS

3/4 cup yellow cornmeal
1 cup plain oatmeal
1 egg
½ cup smooth peanut butter
1 cup warm water
½ cup shredded mozzarella cheese
2 cups whole wheat flour
*Fun-shaped cookie cutters

DIRECTIONS

- 1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees
- Line two baking sheets with parchment paperIn a large bowl, combine the cornmeal, oatmeal and warm water
- 3. Add the peanut butter and egg and mix well
- 4. Add just enough flour to make a workable dough
- 5. Roll out dough to ¼ inch thick, cut shapes with cookie cutter
- 6. Place cut-outs on baking sheets, 1 inch apart
- 7. Bake 30-35 minutes, until the edges start to brown
- 8. Turn off oven, but leave treats inside to dehydrate (for better storage)
- 9. Store inside a tightly-lidded container

THANKSGIVING FEAST DOG KONG

Makes more than one depending on Kong size

INGREDIENTS

1 cup shredded cooked turkey ½ cup sweet potato puree (no added sugar or syrup) ¼ cup dried cranberries Peanut butter

DIRECTIONS

- 1. Plug smallest kong hole with a dab of peanut butter
- 2. Layer sweet potato puree, turkey, and cranberries until you reach the top
- 3. Seal the larger kong hole with peanut butter
- 4. Add a carrot stick to the larger hole as a tantalizer
- 5. Freeze for added challenge and longer lasting enjoyment

TIPS

- You can use other stuffable toys
- Loosely pack stuffable toys for less challenge, more tightly pack for greater challenge




OTHER COMBOS

- Cooked white rice Shredded carrots Shredded zucchini Cream cheese as a plug and sealer
- Cooked mashed potatoes
 Diced cooked chicken
 Peas
 Peanut butter as a plug and sealer



NO BAKE DOG TREAT





INGREDIENTS

1 can pumpkin puree ¼ cup peanut butter ¼ cup plain Greek yogurt

3 cups rolled oats

DIRECTIONS

- 1. Mix pumpkin, peanut butter, and yogurt in a bowl
- 2. Gradually add 2 ½ cups oats, mix well
- 3. Roll mixture into 1 ½ to 1 ½ inch balls, then roll into remaining oats
- 4. Cover and refrigerate until firm (about one hour)
- 5. Store in a tightly-lidded container in refrigerator

DOGGY DECONSTRUCTION BOX



SUPPLIES

- Cardboard Box (large enough for your dog to forage for treats)
- Newspaper or packing paper
- Your dog's favorite treats (you can used diced hot dogs or cheese for extra yummy-ness)
- Dried Oregano or Rosemary for an interesting scent

INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Layer crumpled paper with a few treats and a sprinkle of seasoning throughout box
- 2. Fold flaps closed for added challenge
- 3. Present the box to your dog and let the destruction begin!

- Apples (no seeds)
- Applesauce (unsweetened)
- Baby food (made with dog-safe ingredients)
- Bananas
- Beef (lean, fully cooked)
- Blueberries
- Broccoli
- Cantaloupe
- Carrots
- Celery
- Cheerios (plain)
- Cheese (low fat is best)
- Cottage Cheese
- Cream cheese (soft works best)
- Mozzarella string cheese
- Chicken (skinless, fully cooked)
- Chicken broth (low sodium, check ingredients for additions that may be toxic to dogs)
- Cinnamon (ground, small amounts on occasion)
- Corn
- Cranberries (small amounts on occasion)

- Cucumber
- Eggs (fully-cooked)
- Green beans
- Honey (small amounts on occasion)
- Mango
- Oatmeal (plain)
- Peanut Butter (no xylitol)
- Peaches (no pits)
- Peas
- Pineapple
- Potatoes (fully-cooked)
- Pumpkin
- Rice (white, fully-cooked)
- Salmon (fully-cooked)
- Sardines
- Sweet potatoes
- Tuna (fully-cooked)
- Turkey (skinless, fullycooked)
- Watermelon
- Yogurt (plain, Greek works best)
- Zucchini

RECIPES FOR CATS



BAKED CHICKEN CAT TREAT





INGREDIENTS

1 cup shredded chicken
 1 jar chicken baby food
 Optional: shredded sardines

DIRECTIONS

- 1. Preheat oven to 325 degrees
- 2. Line a baking sheet with parchment paper
- 3. Mix all ingredients in a bowl
- 4. Spread onto baking sheet in an even layer
- 5. Bake for 50 minutes
- 6. Cool, then cut or break into bitesized pieces
- 7.Keep refrigerated

TUNA CAT-SICLES

INGREDIENTS

Canned tuna, packed in water Water Fun silicone popsicle mold or ice cube tray

DIRECTIONS

- 1. Place some bits of tuna into the mold section
- 2. Fill remainder of section with water
- 3. Freeze

SUBSTITUTIONS

- Shredded/canned chicken
- Turkey







Use some of the water from the canned tuna or chicken

SPREADABLE KITTY TREAT





INGREDIENTS

Beef baby food Canned Pumpkin Puree Dry Cat Kibble

DIRECTIONS

- 1. Mix baby food and pumpkin in a bowl
- 2. Spread mixture along the insides of a plastic container, such as a yogurt tub
- 3. Stick on a few pieces of dry kibble
- 4. Freeze for added challenge and longer lasting enjoyment

SUBSTITUTIONS

Chicken baby food

TIP

A fun twist for this treat is to attach a plastic spoon to a chopstick (or similar "stick"), dip the spoon into some of the mixture, then hold the spoon-stick above cat's head to reach for it

MOIST FOOD & CARROT CAT KONG

INGREDIENTS

Your cat's favorite canned food (gravy style works great) Soft-cooked carrots (finely diced) Cat Kong

DIRECTIONS

- 1. Plug the smallest kong hole with piece of cooked carrot
- 2. Layer the kong with canned food and carrots
- 3. Seal the larger kong hole with a bit of pate style canned food
- 4. Freeze for added challenge and longer lasting enjoyment



SUBSTITUTIONS

- Finely diced soft-cooked beans
- Use dry kibble in place of carrots/green beans if your cat isn't big on veggies



CATNIP TEA





INGREDIENTS

1 cup hot water 1 tablespoon dried catnip

DIRECTIONS

- 1. Add catnip to hot water and steep until cool
- 2. Strain using cheesecloth or a strong paper towel
- 3. Serve about a ¼ cup serving into a shallow bowl
- 4. Store remaining tea in the refrigerator

CAT ENRICHMENT

PAWS4EVER

FELINE FUN BOX



INGREDIENTS

- Small box
- Newspaper or packing paper
- Your cat's favorite treats (add diced cooked chicken for extra yummy-ness)
- Dried catnip

INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Layer crumpled paper, a few treats, and a sprinkle of catnip throughout box
- 2. Present the box to your cat and let the party begin!



CAT-SAFE PEOPLE FOOD

Carrots (soft-cooked) Chicken (skinless, fully-cooked) Baby food (made with cat-safe ingredients) Beef (lean, fully-cooked) Broccoli (soft-cooked) Green beans (soft-cooked) Eggs (fully-cooked) Pumpkin Salmon (fully-cooked) Tuna (fully-cooked)



TOXIC HUMAN FOOD FOR CATS

DO NOT give any of these to your cat.

Avocado Chocolate Coffee Chives Garlic Grapes Onion Raisins Yeast

*Dairy - should be avoided due to high fat content and potential stress on a cat's digestive system
