Dear Friends,

2022 was a difficult year for animal sheltering. Inflation and the housing crisis made it hard for people to afford pet care and find housing that accommodates animals. This resulted in many families and their pets being separated and local county shelters becoming overwhelmed. With your help, Paws4ever rescued hundreds of pets from county shelters, which helped to ease overcrowding.

Paws4ever also felt the effects of this hardship through fewer adoptions and longer stays in our Adoption Center, especially for dogs. Thankfully, your support allowed us to provide food, enrichment, toys, treats, and medical care to our pets for as long as it took to find them homes. One dog, Demi, was with us for nearly a year and was recently adopted. To keep her active, our staff and volunteers taught her agility!





Thanks to you, we were able to purchase a new rescue van to safely and comfortably transport animals from county shelters and take our pets to their vet appointments. Transportation is crucial to the rescue work that we do, and the new van will help save pets for years to come.

Your gifts also kept pets out of shelters. More than 600 pet owners in our community turned to Paws4ever last year for supplies or advice on pet care, behavior, or rehoming. Your support meant we could help them keep their pets or assist them in direct rehoming without surrendering to a crowded shelter. Your support also helped hundreds of dog owners through training, which addresses challenges that may otherwise lead to surrender.

The current economic situation continues to impact pets in 2023. Our community needs our help. Let's work together to save more animals and keep pets and their families together! In addition to your financial support, you can make a difference by volunteering, fostering (even for a short "sleepover,") donating supplies, or being a Paws4ever ambassador by sharing about our programs and services.
