

Low Cost Spay and Neuter Options for Feral/Community Cats

These programs are intended for free-roaming feral and/or community cats. Since cats may appear to be feral/community cats, but actually be someone's owned pet, before taking them to get spayed/neutered please contact your local county animal services. If you own the cat, please reference [this document](#) for low cost spay/neuter options instead.

You will be responsible for:

- Trapping the cat in a humane trap (most programs offer traps; however, if they do not have one available, you can also rent a humane trap from Paws4ever)
- Releasing the cat back to the area they were found
- Any other program specific requirements

Unless otherwise specified, one of the cat's ears will be tipped/cropped when they are spayed/neutered to identify them as a sterilized feral/community cat.

If available for your county, the county specific programs (i.e. programs that are only eligible to residents of that county) are typically the best options. County specific options are not available at this time for Caswell, Durham, Guilford, Person, Randolph, or Rockingham counties. For these counties, please skip to the non-county specific section on page 3.

This guide is intended as a reference to help community members easily access information about low-cost spay and neuter options in this area. Paws4ever is not affiliated with, nor does it specifically endorse, any of the programs or services listed. Please use your discretion when choosing where to get your pet spayed/neutered. We do our best to keep this list accurate and up to date, but things can change! Be sure to visit the website for each program to confirm current services, restrictions, prices, and availability.

BAS will check for any sign the cat may have an owner (i.e., collar with tag, microchip, etc) and will attempt to reunite the cat with its owner. If the cat is a missing pet, the three-day hold period provides an opportunity for the owner to find and reclaim their cat. After the 3-day hold period, the cat is examined, vaccinated, and, if not reclaimed by an owner, will be spayed or neutered and ear-tipped before you adopt and take the cat back to your property.
