



PAWS4EVER 2025 IMPACT REPORT

Dear [Salutation],

For Paws4ever, 2025 was defined by growth, innovation, and a deepening commitment to keeping pets safe, healthy, and with their families. We began the year with a major renovation of our Adoption Center, including new epoxy flooring, upgraded kennel doors, and expanded outdoor space for our dogs. These improvements have already created a healthier, more comfortable environment for the pets in our care. We are so grateful for your generosity in making these long-needed upgrades a reality for Paws4ever.



Even with a temporary pause in intake during construction, we increased both pet intakes and adoptions compared to previous years. Our Dog Training Program expanded its offerings with new workshops based on client feedback and served the highest number of pets and pet parents in classes, workshops, and private lessons in our history. We also doubled the footprint of our Resale Store in Hillsborough, and monthly sales have consistently reached record highs. Our Community Pet Support Program continued to grow as more families learned about our resources. A highlight of the year was launching a fourth program pillar, Pawsitive Spaces, in partnership with Orange County Animal Services. Through this initiative, we build safe, secure fenced enclosures for dogs who would otherwise be tethered or roaming, improving their safety and quality of life.

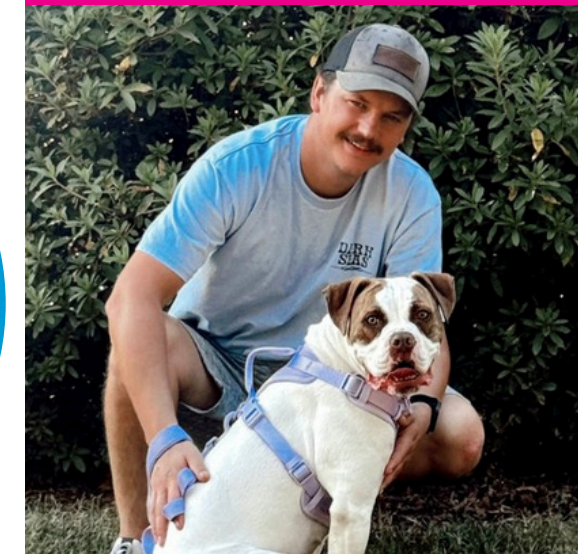
We also expanded our reach through a new adoption partnership with Feeders Pet Supply of Chapel Hill, where 10 of our cats found loving homes in 2025. In addition, we introduced our Pawditiion program, offering adopters a 7-day trial period to ensure the best possible match. This initiative has been especially impactful for medium and large dogs, helping reduce their length of stay and increasing successful placements.

As we look ahead, I am energized by the growth of our organization and the opportunities we have to continue to make a difference for pets and pet parents in our community. This year, Paws4ever will work on expanding the impact of our Community Pet Support Program and strengthening our foster network so we can save even more lives in the year ahead.

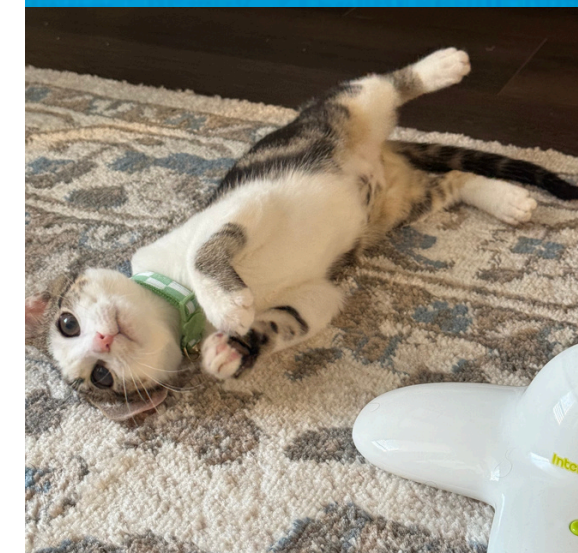


HAPPY TAILS

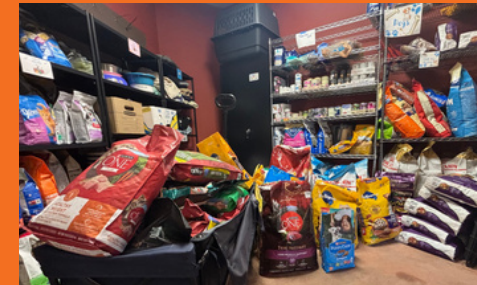

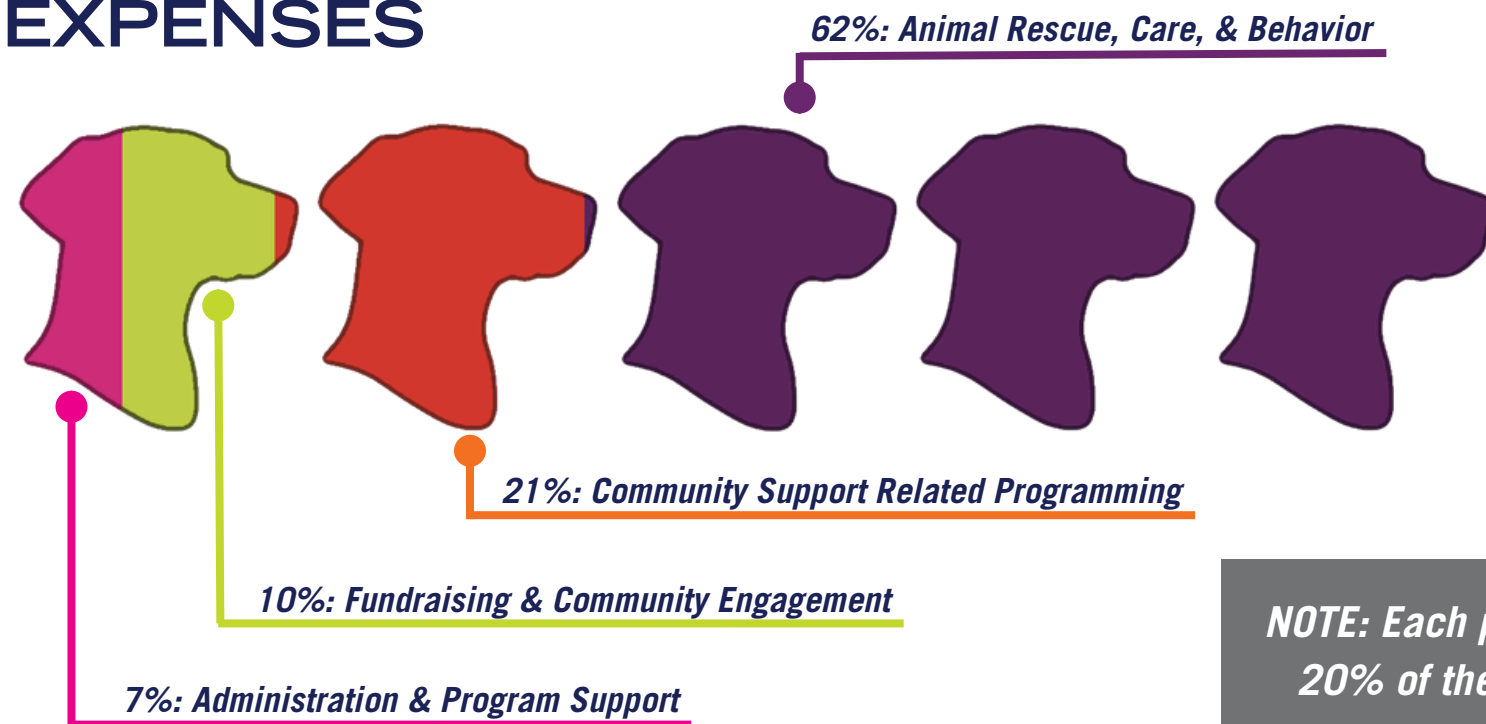

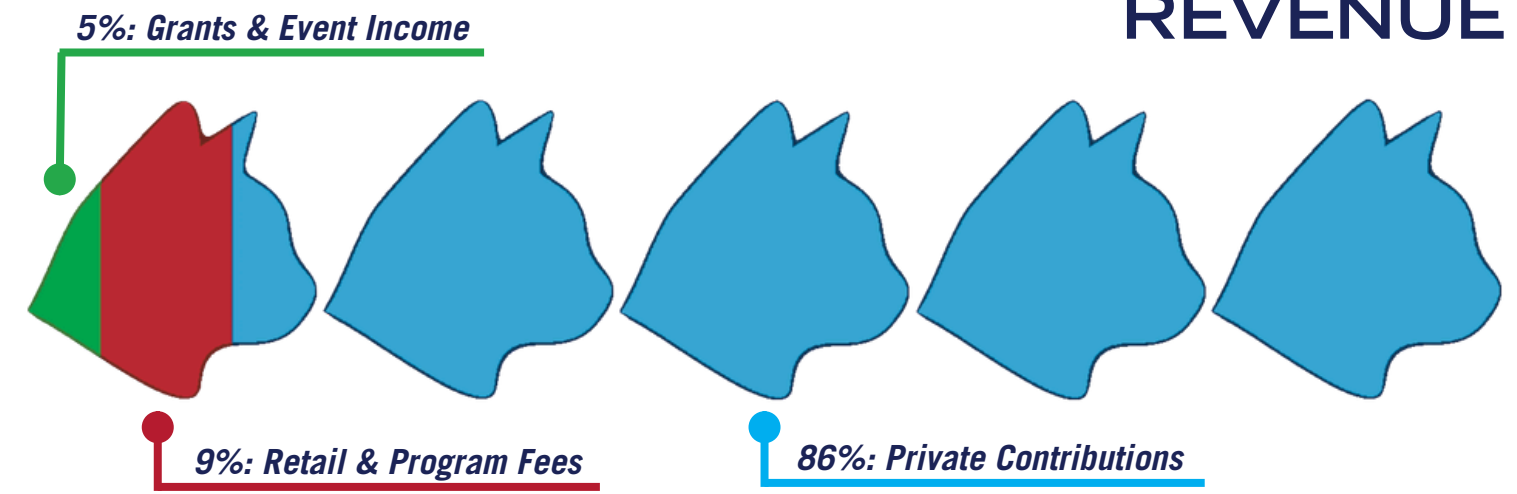
2025 Financial Overview
